Important Rules for Camp

1. When camping, no youth is permitted to sleep in the tent of an adult other than their own parent or guardian.
2. Parents must accompany scouts to camp. Scouts may not be dropped off and parents are encouraged to participate in, and help organize, activities. (See inside for details)
3. There are ticks and other insects in the camp and we must prepare for this. Insect repellent along with clothing that tucks in are recommended.
4. We will camp in the rain. Raingear or ponchos should be packed just in case.
5. Only scouts that have their whittling chip may carry pocketknives.
6. There are no pets of any kind allowed at the campout.
7. No aerosol cans, electronic games, fireworks, weapons of any kind, or alcohol will be allowed at camp.
8. Scout uniforms should be worn traveling to and from camp, at the campfire on Saturday night, and at worship service on Sunday morning. Scouting appropriate T-shirts should be worn for activities.

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What you will need to bring:

- Tent including poles and rain fly, (A few are available to borrow so sign up quickly)
- Mallet for tent stakes
- Appropriate clothing for the weather, (poncho, Class A uniform, Class B scout shirt or T-shirt)
- Sleeping bags, blankets, pillows
- Comfortable shoes for walking
- Insect repellent
- Camp chairs or stools
- Flashlights with spare batteries
- Cub Scout Handbook

What we recommend you bring:

- Backpack for carrying items throughout the day's activities
- Bag for dirty/wet clothes
- Towel
- Handkerchief or small towel
- Hat
- Sunglasses
- Sunscreen
- Small first aid kit, (you can never have too many of these at camp)
- Camera
- Compass
- Pen, Pencil, and Notebook
